

Vocabulary List for Pre-Christmas Prophecies Videos

Here are a few definitions you will want to know to understand the context of the Old Testament better.

Jesus - Comes from the Latin form of the Greek name Ἰησοῦς (Iēsous), a rendition of the Hebrew Yeshua (ישוע), related to the name Joshua. Old English used Hælend “Savior.” The word means “to save, Savior or Salvation.”

Jehovah is translated as "The Existing One" or “Lord” and derived from the Hebrew word Havah. Jehovah is the pre-mortal Jesus. Paul in 1 Corinthians chapter 10 declares Jesus Christ as the God of Ancient Israel.

Immanuel - “God with us”

Christ - Greek and English word meaning “anointed.” Christ is Jesus’ title, not his name, Jesus The Christ

Messiah - Hebrew and Aramaic word meaning “anointed” See Ps. 2:2; Isa. 61:1–3; Luke 4:16–32; Acts 4:23–30; 10:38.

Anointed One - chosen, nominated, consecrated, blessed, ordained as successor, leader, examples. Jesus is the one anointed of the Father to be His personal representative in all things pertaining to the salvation of mankind.

Christmas - “to send out the anointed one”

Christ - “anointed one”

Mass - Latin (missa) means “to send out” (like the word dismiss)

Prophetic Symbolism - the use of symbols to accurately describing or predicting what will happen in the future. The Bible is full of prophetic symbolism.

Theologians call these prophetic symbols type or shadow.
